



COFFEE OR FRUIT JUICE
Sponge with or soak in cold water. Spray with a stain remover or apply a small amount of detergent directly to the stain. Wash as directed.

DEODORANT OR ANTIPERSPIRANT
Spray with a stain remover or apply a small amount of detergent directly to the stain. Wash in hottest water safe for the fabric. If fabric is discolored, treat new stains with ammonia and old stains with vinegar then rinse thoroughly and re-wash.

COSMETICS
Spray with a stain remover or apply a small amount of detergent directly to the stain. Wash in hottest water safe for the fabric.

BLOOD
Soak in cold water. Apply a small amount of detergent directly to the stain. Wash in hottest water safe for the fabric.

CATSUP/KETCHUP
Scrape off excess. Soak in cold water and spray with a stain remover or apply a small amount of detergent directly to the stain. Wash in hottest water safe for the fabric.

GUM
Rub stained area with ice. Remove excess gum carefully. Spray with a stain remover or apply a small amount of detergent directly to the stain. Wash in hottest water safe for the fabric.

INK
Sponge stain with rubbing alcohol, or spray with stain remover or hair spray until wet looking. Rinse thoroughly and wash as directed.

NAIL POLISH
Place stain face down on paper towels. Sponge with nail polish remover until stain disappears. Rinse thoroughly and wash in hottest water safe for the fabric.

GRASS
Spray with a stain remover or apply a small amount of detergent directly to the stain and wash as directed. If stain remains, re-apply stain remover, soak in warm water, rinse thoroughly and re-wash.

URINE OR VOMIT
Scrape to remove solids. Soak in warm water. Spray with a stain remover or apply a small amount of detergent directly to the stain. Wash as directed, using bleach if needed.
